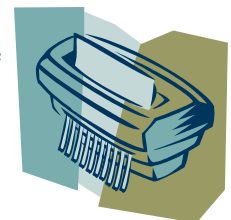

3. North [Atlantic Ocean](#) storms are named by the [U.S. National Hurricane Center](#) from name lists. There have been six lists of names in use since 1979. The lists make use of names from both sexes. They are in alphabetical order and lists are recycled after six years, although the names of notable hurricanes are retired by the NHC on request. All letters of the alphabet are used except Q, U, X, Y and Z.

*Believe it or not, there are two barbed wire museums: Devil's Rope Museum in McLean, Texas, 75 miles east of Amarillo, on I-40 & Old Route 66 and the Kansas Barbed Wire Museum, 120 W 1st St. in Lacrosse, KS.
