SUBJECT: Proposed Changes to Chapter 23.5 City Code, Civil Citations

In the attached proposed Ordinance, you will find the following the proposed changes to Chapter 23.5:

1. The definition of Repeat Violation is being amended to include persons who have been found guilty by reason of default.
2. Class I Violation is being amended to include Section 22-1, 19-26 and 19-27. There is also a provision that all other sections of the Tampa City Code that are not specifically set forth in the fines schedule will be a Class I Violation.
3. Class III Violation is being amended to include several sections of Chapter 22.
4. Class IV Violation is being amended to include several provisions from Chapter 22, sections from Chapter 25 and sections from Chapter 27, including the demolition by neglect and serving of alcohol at premises without a permit.

4 THE DEFINITION OF REPEAT VIOLATION; AMENDING SECTION
5 23.5-5, SCHEDULE OF VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES TO ADD
6 TAMPA CITY CODE SECTIONS FROM CHAPTERS 19, 22, 25, AND
7 27 TO ALLOW ENFORCEMENT OF THOSE SECTIONS BY THE
8 CIVIL CITATION PROCESS; TO DESIGNATE AS A CLASS I
9 VIOLATION ANY VIOLATION OF THE TAMPA CITY CODE NOT
10 ALREADY SET FORTH IN THE SCHEDULE OF FINES AND
11 PENALTIES; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF ALL ORDINANCES IN
12 CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN
13 EFFECTIVE DATE.

15 **WHEREAS**, the City Council passed an ordinance significantly amending Tampa
16 City Code Chapter 23.5 to improve the City’s ability to issue civil citations for violations
17 of the Tampa City Code; and

18
19 **WHEREAS**, Section 23.5-5. Schedule of Violations and Penalties was created as
20 part of the amendments to City Code Chapter 23.5; and

21
22 **WHEREAS**, it is the desire of Tampa City Council to amend Section 23.5-5 to
23 amend the definition of Repeat Violation; and

24
25 **WHEREAS**, it is the desire of Tampa City Council to amend Section 23.5-5 to
26 include violations from Tampa City Code Chapter 19 regarding rental certificates so that
27 the violations can be enforced by the civil citation process; and

28
29 **WHEREAS**, it is the desire of Tampa City Council to amend Section 23.5-5 to
30 include violations from Tampa City Code Chapter 22 – Streets and Sidewalks and
31 Chapter 25 – Transportation, regarding the use of rights of way so that the violations can
32 be enforced by the civil citation process; and

33
34 **WHEREAS**, it is the desire of Tampa City Council to amend Section 23.5-5 to
35 include violations from Tampa City Code Chapter 27 – Zoning, regarding demolition by
36 neglect and regarding serving alcohol at a premises without a permit so that said
37 violations can be enforced by the civil citation process; and

38
39 **WHEREAS**, it is the desire of Tampa City Council to amend Section 23.5-5 to
40 designate, as a Class I violation, any violation of the Tampa City Code not already
41 specifically set forth in the Schedule of Fines and Penalties so that the violations can be
42 enforced by the civil citation process; and

44 **WHEREAS**, The City Council of the City of Tampa has determined that the
45 following amendments promote and protect the general health, safety and welfare of the
46 residents of the City of Tampa; and

In addition to the code sections set forth above, any other section or provision of the Tampa City Code that is not specifically set forth in the other Classes of the Schedule of Violations and Penalties shall be a Class I violation.

(b) Violations of the following sections of the Tampa City Code are considered Class II violations and will carry a fine of:

\$150.00 for a first offense,
\$300.00 for a second offense
\$450.00 for a third or subsequent offense

1 (e) Violations of 26-97 as well as any subsequent emergency or other amending
2 ordinances related to irrigation and other outdoor water use are considered Class W

9 **Section 3.** That should a court of competent jurisdiction declare any part of
10 this Ordinance invalid the remaining parts hereof shall not, in any way, be affected by
11 such determination as to the invalid part.

13 **Section 4.** That all ordinances, parts of ordinances, or resolutions in conflict
14 herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any conflict.
15

16 **Section 5.** That this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon becoming a
17 law.
