SEWER LATERAL UPDATE #15

GREAT NEWS: After reviewing all the documents that we submitted, the City Attorney determined that the City of Richmond IS responsible for maintaining and repairing the sewer lines that run under the streets and alleys of Atchison Village. The City Engineering Department will be working with AVMHC to determine how and when that work will be done. Again, the Village should be grateful to all those who worked hard to make this happen, especially Marie Kochaver, Karen Wargo and Robert Stupack, my fellow committee members Marcy Rein and Gretchen Blais, and Richmond's Mayor and Engineering Department. Many thanks to all!

On a less upbeat note, as we face the huge amount of work that AVMHC needs to do over the next few years in order to keep our sewer problems from overwhelming us, everyone in the Village will need to get creative in coming up with ways to increase our revenues. So far, the successful efforts of our committee have only brought in about 5% of the total amount we are going to need to get the job done.

At present, bids are being reviewed for the problem lines on block 6, mainly the ones near the corner of Curry and West MacDonald that have needed stopgap repairs seven times over the past year. At the February 8 Board meeting, the Board will choose the contractor to replace those lines. Once that work is completed, our committee will apply for City grants that will help the Village pay for the next phase that may be on block 4 or 5, where there have also been recent problems.

The scale of this job is huge, but like Rosie the Riveter, we all need to say, "Yes, we can!"


Motion RE12142011.08 – to table the issue of Chevron/monitoring stations in order to seek more information from the city of Richmond and Chevron – and to bring back to the board.

The motion passes.



We are now certified by the Environmental Protection Agency to work on lead-based paint and we take all the necessary precautions required by OSHA, the EPA and California Air Resources Board.
