WESTWOOD TO CREATE POLLINATOR GARDEN—YOU CAN HELP!

In 2007, the WNA voted to create a native plant garden at the corner of 56th and Welker. On May 22nd, the WNA voted to transform the corner into a pollinator garden in association with the Plant Grow Fly program spear-headed by the Blank Park Zoo. This program encourages city residents and neighborhoods to create such gardens throughout the city. More information on the zoo initiative is at www.blankparkzoo.com.

The goal of the transformation is: 1) to make the area more visually attractive; 2) to better serve the needs of bees, butterflies and other pollinators; and, 3) to use volunteer events at the garden as a learning center where neighborhood residents can learn difference between weeds and the invasive vegetation that should be removed from our gardens/yards and native and other plants that should be nurtured.

These goals will be accomplished through neighborhood volunteer events on the third Saturday of each month from 9:30 am - 11:30 am with such events continuing until the snow flies. The next few dates will be July 19, August 16 and September 20. Events are weather dependent and you can join the events in progress. All you need to bring are your gloves, and maybe a drink and your favorite gardening tool. Go Green.

CICADA HUNTERS IN WESTWOOD

The MacKrells on 56th Street were surprised by three visitors who asked to collect a few of the thousands of cicadas in their yard — visitors who had come from Japan!

Professor Jin Yoshimura and two assistants from Shizuoka University in Japan collected specimens and filled the family in on the two types of cicadas that were hatching in their yard—one of which, the professor noted, tastes very similar to shrimp when cooked.



TIPS FOR DEALING WITH OUR PERIODICAL VISITORS

If you are curious about Professor Yoshimura's proclamation regarding their taste, **don't eat them if you are allergic to seafood.** Both cicadas and shrimp are arthropods. In addition, you should know cicadas are bioaccumulators of mercury.

They'll land on you if you're using a power tool or lawn mower. Cicadas think the sounds made by power tools and lawn maintenance equipment are made by cicadas. They get confused and will land on the people using the equipment! **Pro-tip**: cut your lawn in the early morning or near dusk when the cicadas are less active.

Cicada Rain: It's actually cicada "pee," so wear a hat when walking under trees if that sort of thing bothers you. Cicadas drink tree fluids, and then expel the excess fluid they do not need.

They damage wimpy trees: the biggest concern about 17 year cicadas is their potential to damage young trees. If you have weak ornamental trees in your yard, you may consider placing netting around the trees, hosing them off with water, placing insect barrier tape around the trunk of the trees, or picking the cicadas off like grapes! In their defense, cicadas actually benefit the health of trees by aerating the soil around the roots.

JOIN THE UPCYCLE STEWARDS TO HELP GREENWOOD AND THE ZOO

Animals at the Blank Park Zoo want/need/love to eat fresh vegetation such as the invasive honeysuckle shrub, abundant in Greenwood Park, the oldest and most treasured park in the city. Honeysuckle blossoms and the bright, red berries are pretty but this aggressive species is rapidly taking over the natural habitat of our city parks' ecosystems.

Through the new UPCYCLE Stewards program, a partnership between Trees Forever and Des Moines Parks and Recreation, volunteers learn to identify invasive plant species and then help remove them from the park, allowing native plants to grow without competition. The harvest is then transported to the zoo as a feast for zoo animals. An additional goal of the program is to teach residents alternative native species to plant in gardens and yards instead of invasive species.

At the inaugural "work day" on Saturday, June 14, WNA residents and other volunteers, along with the park, zoo and conservation staff, removed a massive pile of trees, vines and shrubby growth from the park, enough to feed zoo animals for several days. A caravan to the zoo concluded the work session providing the opportunity to observe animals eating the day's harvest, and the vegetation collected was enough to keep the animals fed for several days!

If you missed the last opportunity, the remaining workdays have been set. The events will be held at Greenwood Park from

9 am to 12 pm. Signs will be there to direct volunteers.
