MINUTES OF THE FEBRUARY 5, 2015 MEETING

The members of the South Atlantic Neighborhood Association (SANA) enjoyed a casual dinner and, following dinner, the February meeting was called to order by President Mike Denis at 6:58 pm at the Peninsula Club.

Officer Newcomb of the Daytona Beach Police Department addressed the group, explaining that our South Atlantic Neighborhood falls within Zone 55. He gave a brief overview of recent crime in the neighborhood and, on the whole, things have been quiet. Two cars were stolen but in both cases the keys were left in the car with the motor running. There have also been items such as electronics stolen from cars left unlocked. The police are undertaking active enforcement of the prohibition against junked cars stored in yards. Officer Newcomb invited everyone to "Coffee with a Cop" at McDonald's on A1A from 8-10 next Tuesday morning, February 10th.

The minutes of the January meeting were read and approved. The Treasurer reported a current balance of \$2356.53.

Guest speaker Glenn Storch delivered a presentation accompanied by video slides regarding a proposal by the Halifax Civic League for improvements to beachside East International Speedway Boulevard. The SANA membership raised questions and provided comments about various aspects of the ISB proposal.

A 50-50 raffle yielded \$66. The raffle winner donated his share, \$33, to the SANA Treasury.

The March 5th SANA meeting will provide an important opportunity for residents of our neighborhood to have input into various "traffic calming" measures that are being considered with respect to the impending development of the Hard Rock project.
