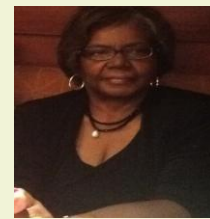
Treasurer:

One such neighbors is Reverend Mack Simmons whom is the Senior Pastor of Welcome All Baptist Church (755 Bolton Rd) in Atlanta and a longtime Heritage Valley resident on Pine Cone drive. Rev Simons was a graduate of Morris Brown and was once part of the Atlanta Student Movement in the 60's which as a integral part of the civil rights fight . Maybe you have gotten a opportunity to meet him at the HV annual Christmas gathering which he assists in organizing each year or delivering a word of prayer when needed at community gatherings. However what you might not know is that due to his efforts in the civil rights era he is featured in Sheila Pree Brights 1960 public art series in downtown Atlanta on Trinity Avenue. This exhibit highlights many unknown faces of that era however; the fact that our very own neighbor and community member is highlighted makes us beam with pride and we are so grateful for his sacrifices and bravery. Springtime checklist



Hallelujah. Spring has arrived. For those of us who've been trapped inside our homes trying to stay out of the cold, we now get to rediscover the outside world again. It's also time for some home maintenance items that will help you avoid big repair bills later on.

1. Inspect your roof.
2. Clean your gutters
3. Power wash house and driveway, fences and outside surfaces.
4. Clean or replace your HVAC filters.

6. Clear vegetation around your AC compressor.
