Next month is a great time to make room for your car in your garage:

Free Dumpster Days. June 12-June 15. We will have 2 dumpsters from the City for clean landfill materials. They will be in the same locations as last year, on Centerwood and on Indian Creek Drive by the pool.

Garage Sale. Mark your calendars and clean out your closets!! Our annual garage sale will be Saturday, June 13th, starting at 9:00 am. BWHOA will announce on Craigslist and in The Oregonian.

BWHOA Trash Pick Up. The annual Trash Pick-Up is set for Monday, June 15. Place your items in common piles in the cul-de-sacs or on the main streets by 8:00 am.

Please help the BWHOA save \$\$ by using the free City-provided dumpsters first and by watching for people coming in from outside the neighborhood to drop off their discards—your dues pay by the pound for the June 15 pick-up.

PLEASE DO NOT INCLUDE the following items in either trash pick up:

NO item so large that 2 people are needed to carry it to the street: water heaters, major appliances, sofas, large BBQ's. Reusable items should be donated; recyclable items should go to Portland Recycling Center at 341 Foothills Road, Lake Oswego, 503-228-5375.

NO large construction/remodeling materials, fence materials, cement blocks, etc. Reusable construction materials may be taken to places like the Re-Build Center, Hippo Hardware, and Habitat Restore; wood/ organic waste may be taken to the Metro South Transfer Station or Portland Recycling Centers.

NO hazardous materials, including batteries, liquids, computers, TV's pesticides, chemical, and paint. Metro will host a free household hazardous waste drop-off on Saturday, June 13, at Tigard High School, 9000 SW Durham Rd, from 9 am to 2 pm.

NO yard debris. Bag this up and put it with the regular curb-side yard debris can for Wednesday pick-up.

NO tires. These can be taken to the Metro Transfer Station in Oregon City.

When you pick up your pool key during one of the times posted above, *make sure to bring your old key to exchange for the new one*. Pool forms and Pool Rules will be available at the exchange but you can save time by downloading them from bwhoa.org and coming to the exchange with the form already filled out. Please be aware that persons with delinquent dues and persons who received CC&R violations and have not cured them *will not receive keys*. This is in accordance with our CC&R's. If your dues are not current you may bring a check made out to BWHOA to the key exchange. The check must be for the full amount including interest. Also bring your April 30 statement. Contact Kathy Taylor, treasurer@bwhoa.org, about past due charges. Contact Linda Fuchs with any questions you have about your CC&R violation. If you know of an issue, it would be easiest for you to deal with it in advance of the exchange. Thank you.

Pool News, by Holly Gosewehr

Things are getting exciting at the Pool! Opening day is just around the corner and we're finishing up our preparations in readiness for opening on Saturday, May 23rd at 10 am.

- Lifeguards and Maintenance staff are still being hired; see *Help Wanted* ads on the last page.
- WetKat pool service, which was successful last year in keeping our pool chemically balanced, will be on board again this year.
- We will be adding a Lifeguard shed behind the large pool for storing lifeguard and maintenance supplies.
 The shed will house daily use items for both lifeguards and maintenance that currently are stored in the
 pool building. The pool building is full of pumps, heaters, pipes, chemicals, etc. and it is difficult to move
 around in there safely without banging into the equipment. This shed is scheduled to be completed by the
 end of May.
- The limit on guests you can bring without giving 2-day notice and paying a \$40 fee has been reduced, from 10 to 6, to ensure adequate lifeguard staffing.
- Because no one has volunteered to be Grill Master, the barbecue will not be available (except for Association functions, e.g. July 4). Volunteers, anyone?
- Lifeguards won't start until June 11th. Please be aware of this for safety reasons.
- SWIM LESSONS. Sessions will be July 6-17, 12-2 pm, and August 10-21, 5-7pm. Contact Holly (puananig@comcast.net) for more information.
- SWIM DIAPERS Reminder that all children (guests as well) under 4 years of age or not potty trained must wear a swim diaper and a waterproof covering. We had a couple of issues last year and while things do happen, I can't stress to you enough the importance of following this policy. Anytime there is an accident, we will close the pool affected. It takes TIME for the chlorine to be able to counteract what happened. At least 30 minutes for stool or vomit. For diarrhea, which is very serious, it will be 12+ hours depending on how quickly we can get the chemicals up to speed. Please know this is for your own protection! DO NOT BRING A CHILD TO THE POOL WHO HAS HAD DIARRHEA WITHIN THE LAST 4 DAYS, as he or she may still be contagious.

May Board Meeting Notes, by Rebekah Smith

Finance: Kathy Taylor found ways to save approximately \$2000 per year by streamlining our accounting and banking services, including our utility payments, payroll process, time sheets, and remote deposit. Payroll will be processed by ZenPayroll and timekeeping will be completed with TSheets. Kathy developed a credit card policy and cardholder agreement to make payment and reimbursement of HOA expenses much quicker and more efficient. To implement Kathy's recommendations, the Board voted to move the BWHOA accounts to US Bank.

Pool: Our pools will open on Saturday, May 23! The solar heater will be used to provide the initial pool warm-up; new bathroom tile is installed; furniture is being cleaned; and Holly ordered a new "Pool Rules" sign to replace one that went missing. There are still a few openings for pool maintenance and lifeguarding. Also, the Board voted to reduce the number of guests allowed without a reservation, from 10 to 6. This new pool policy allows lifeguards time to plan for additional guests and thereby have a safer pool experience for everyone (please see Holly's Pool News, above, for details!).

Social: Details for the annual Dumpster Days, Bryant Woods Garage Sale, and Trash Pickup are provided in Gina's Social Events.

Architectural: The following architectural changes have been approved by the Board:

4861 Sage Hen Way-- paint house existing color (Kelly Moore Malibu Beige) and paint the trim Castledale.

18771 Indian Creek Way—paint new garage door grey (Sherman Williams "Cyberspace") to match house.

Common Area Maintenance: Pathway repairs and seal coating are completed. Eleven dead or hazardous trees will be removed along the path in the main Common Area after bids are finalized and permits obtained. Bids have been solicited and 5 cut permits have been obtained. Don is seeking bids to replace the French drain at the pool. The existing drain, which prevents ponding of water near the western pool boundary fence, no longer functions. Shrub beds at the pool will receive new mulch on May 20. The West Side Common Boundary has been surveyed and monuments will be placed to demarcate the boundary between Bryant Woods HOA and our neighbors. A drawing of the boundary will be prepared within the month and registered with the county. The Board will consider at the next meeting a member's request to remove the large stump remaining from the oak tree that blew down March 14 along the central pathway.

Other Board Business: The Board voted unanimously to change its insurance policy to increase the scope and coverage limits of the Association's insurance. The additional premium for this fiscal year will be paid from savings in other areas. The Board met in executive session for approximately 20 minutes to discuss a possible agreement with a non-member neighbor regarding a dispute, including discussion of legal advice from the Association's attorney.
