The subject that is at the front of everyone's mind is #1- crime in our area and #2- the abandoned, burned, or neglected homes in our community and the lack of Codes Enforcement to deal with these eyesores.

We believe that crime and the neglected properties are connected as well as declining property values, higher crime, lack of County Enforcement with all three hurting our neighborhoods.

Now a Laundry is proposed by an out of Walker County builder on James St. and Wilson Road. We oppose this as we feel this may possibly contribute to more problems to our area.

Per the Walker County Sheriff and the Walker County Fire Dept. - Each visited the same 6 locations within a ½ mile of this proposed laundry over 800 times in the last 15 months. This is unacceptable as homeowners and business owners in this end of the county.

It's time we the residents start taking back our community and standing up for our rights as voters, tax payers and home owners and businesses.
